Included in these ranks were Northerners of Southern birth and white and black men living in various Southern states: Tennessee, Missouri, Kentucky, Virginia, etc. The major portion of the work, however, is a chronological history of the war which highlights contributions made by Southern Federals and a list of those who commanded brigades or naval vessels. The valuable personal reminiscences are interlarded with considerable superficial summarization of events elsewhere in Virginia, but the first-person accounts of four years of war in the Valley are worth searching out." Claiborne was a member of the Virginia legislature before the war and was elected to the Virginia Secession Convention. His war experience was as surgeon of the 12th Virginia Infantry and as director of a military hospital in Petersburg. Some excellent material on field medical services, supply shortages, and Confederate surgical efforts is recorded from this period ...
